NEWS AND VIEWS

Today is <u>Palm Sunday</u>- the first day of Holy Week. In Spain the day is called *Pascua Florida*- a name which in turn was given to the American state of Florida because it was discovered on Palm Sunday by Spanish explorers. We will receive small palm crosses today to remind us both of the joy of the first Palm Sunday and of what was to happen on the Friday of the same week. Tomorrow is <u>Lady Day</u>- a day that commemorates the 'Annunciation' – the day exactly 9 months before Christmas Day, which marks the archangel Gabriel's visit to Mary to tell her she is to be the mother of Jesus. **Easter Cross**- look out for the cross on the railings this week – and be prepared to deck it with flowers as we remember the death of our Lord Jesus and celebrate his resurrection on Easter Sunday.

POINTS FOR PRAYER

From the "Unbounded Love" liturgy for this week: "Unbounded God, we thank you that you rode humbly into Jerusalem that day, knowing what pain and misery lay before you. You received short-lived praise from the crowd who spread their cloaks before you, but would soon reject you, and condemn you to death. Lord Jesus, we place a coat at the cross to remind us that we need to let go of things that bring us status in this world. Help us to stay true to you, knowing that you are the source of life. Holy God, we cast our crowns before thee." In the circuit we pray for the congregation at Chew Stoke and we remember the students at Chapel House.
